# 2025 NBSTSA Student Academic Merit Awards

NBSTSA's legacy award honors Dalton Gay, a student and athlete from North Carolina, who excelled in his academic and athletic pursuits and was deeply dedicated to public service. Dalton had a passion for helping to improve the lives of those less fortunate than himself both in his community and internationally. Dalton's young life was cut short due to illness at age 17; however, his contributions and impact on the lives he touched with his generosity continues. NBSTSA is honoring Dalton's legacy with an award to students who demonstrate that same passion and dedication to education and service.

#### **Eligibility:**

- 1. Current student in a CAAHEP or ABHES accredited school/program at time of application submission.
- 2. Completion of 1 semester or year of surgical technology or surgical first assisting education

#### Before Starting the Application All the Following Documents Are Required

- 1. A transcript (from your school) verifying your cumulative GPA
- 2. Submission of 5 essays
- 3. 2 letters of recommendation
- 4. Lists of achievements
- 5. Personal resume

Incomplete applications will not be considered. The application must be filled out, signed and accompanied by all required supporting documentation.

#### 5 Essays (limited to 250 words for each):

- Personal Essay: Why you are pursuing a career in surgical technology, your motivation for entering the field, financial or other unique challenges you have overcome up to this point, and how this scholarship will help you achieve your educational and career goals. (250-word limit)
- 2. Clinical Experience: Provide details of your clinical experience, including specific rotations or cases that have been particularly meaningful or challenging. (250-word limit)
- **3.** Career Goals: Describe your long-term career goals in surgical technology and how you plan to contribute to the profession. (250-word limit)
- 4. Leadership Roles: Describe any leadership positions you've held (e.g., student organizations, class projects, community initiatives). (250-word limit)
- 5. Volunteer Work/Community Service: Share details of any volunteer work or community service you've been involved in, particularly as related to healthcare or surgical services. (250-word limit)

#### 2 Letters of Recommendations:

**#1**: From a faculty member or clinical instructor supporting your application.

**#2**: From a healthcare professional, employer, or mentor attesting to your abilities and commitment to the profession.

#### Academic Achievements and Involvement:

List any academic honors, awards, or distinctions you have received.

List of Professional Conferences, Workshops, or Meetings Attended: State Assembly, HOSA, AST Honor Society, etc. if applicable

#### **Additional information:**

A copy of your transcript must be obtained from your school website or Academics office, clearly showing the school, all courses/grades, and overall grade point average (GPA).

A current resume or CV highlighting your academic, clinical, and extracurricular experiences.
